FIRING STARTS AT: 8:00 am on Saturday
Prep periods start three minutes before firing.

OPEN TO: Individual NRA members and junior members of NRA affiliated clubs.

PLACE: Reading Rifle & Revolver Club Range, Haverhill Street, Reading, MA.
From Route I-95 (State 128) north or south, take exit 40 towards North Reading on Haverhill Street for one mile north. Turn right at traffic light. Bear right away from ice rink and through gate to clubhouse. **Phone number** at club on day of match only is 781-942-1027.

ENTRIES: Advance. Limited to 60 competitors. A waiting list will be maintained in the order received to fill cancellations. Please include your phone number. Post entries will be accepted to fill relay vacancies only.

FEES: Package entry fee: \$40.00, matches 1-8. Total fee includes registration, souvenir pin, and Matches 1-8. Fee also includes a commemorative tee-shirt. Tee-shirt not included in match fee for walk-ins. See separate program for NBPRP "LEG" Match entry and fees, which will be fired on Sunday. Make checks payable to Reading R & R Match Account.

PIT SERVICE: Not Provided. Competitors may supply pullers or we may have pullers available on a first come first served basis.

RIFLE/SIGHTS: NRA Match Rifle, Service Rifle M1, M14 or M16 may be used. There will be two Divisions: NRA Match Rifle and the Service Rifle. Metallic sights only.

MATCHES:

- #1 Individual Match, offhand, 2 ss, 20 record, 200 yards, 22 minutes.
- #2 Individual Match, 2 ss, 20 shots rapid fire, sitting, 200 yards
- #3 Individual Match, 2 ss, 20 record, rapid fire, prone, 300 yards.
- #4 Individual Match, slow prone, 2 ss, 20 record, 600 yards, 22 minutes.
- #5 Individual Match, slow prone, 2 ss, 20 record, 600 yards, 22 minutes.
- #6 Slow Fire Aggregate - Aggregate of Matches 1, 4 and 5.
- #7 Rapid Fire Aggregate - Aggregate of Matches 2 and 3.
- #8 High Power Rifle Regional Championship - Grand Aggregate Matches 1-5.

RULES: Current NRA High Power Rules. NRA rule 11.6.7(b) is waived: Competitors will fire offhand and sitting rapid prior to pit change. OPEN BOLT INDICATOR: Will be required to be used. No 55 or 62 grain .223 ammo may be fired at 600 yards.

FIRING ORDER: Matches 1-4 will be fired on Saturday. Every attempt will be made to fire Match 5 on Saturday, but it may be fired on Sunday. The Excellence-in-Competition NBPRP "LEG" Match will be fired Sunday.

SQUADDING: All relays will be squadded. Arrive early enough to pick up squadding which will be available Saturday commencing at 7:30 am, and Sunday at 7:30 am. Squadding not picked up 15 minutes prior to start of firing each day will be passed to the waiting list.

CLASSIFICATION: The NRA Classification system will be used in all matches. Shooters who do not hold a High Power Classification card or a Temporary Score Book may use an assigned classification or fire in the Master Class.

AWARDS: High Power and Long Range regional credit guidelines 2011. The National Rifle Association will award each High Power and Long Range regional Camp Perry fee credit certificates to supplement the current Gold, Silver and Bronze medallions and team award points. Each certificate is good for 50% off the entry fee for the NRA High power or Long Range Championships. The Camp Perry entry fee credit certificates will be awarded according to the following guidelines: Match Winner always receives an entry credit. A credit will not be given to the class winner in the match winner's class. Example: If the match winner is a High Master, then no other High Master will receive a credit. Class winners (other than Match Winner's class) receive an entry credit providing there are ten competitors in that class in the aggregate. Classes may be combined in order to achieve minimums. Supported shooters: (i.e. any service shooter receiving financial support), are not eligible to receive a Camp Perry Credit. Competitors can win only one certificate per event (High Power or Long Range) per year. A credit certificate won at a High Power Regional can be used for entry in the High Power phase at Camp Perry. A credit won at a Long Range Regional can be used for entry in the Long Range phase. Credits will be passed down within class if won by an ineligible person: I.E. any competitor who has already received a credit certificate, or a supported shooter. Junior and Collegiate shooters may refuse to accept a credit to protect collegiate eligibility. That credit may be passed down to the next eligible shooter. Credit certificates earned will expire two years after date of issuing the award.

Match 8 Regional Championship Awards: Winner: NRA Regional Gold Medallion; 2nd Place: NRA Regional Silver Medallion; 3rd Place: NRA Regional Bronze Medallion

Special Awards: In Match 8: High Woman/Junior/Senior awards will be made if five or more enter the match.

National Championship Credit Award: The highest shooter in each class (providing there are a minimum of 5 shooters in that classification in the Match 8) will receive \$40 credit towards entry fees to Camp Perry in High Power. The

credit is valid for 13 months and is not transferable. An individual may win more than one credit within a "Camp Perry Year", but cannot exceed entry fees. A total of only 5 credits will be given. A credit will be given to the highest in class (min. 5 competitors each) without regard to category (no combining of classes). The overall winner of the Regional will win a credit regardless of the number of competitors in his/her class.

ACCOMMODATIONS: Clubhouse available for overnight use on Friday and Saturday. Non-club members must make advance arrangements to ensure club gate access. Many motels Ramada Inn, Days Inn. Lord Wakefield, Colonial Hilton, Wakefield; Koala Inn, Woburn; Susse Chalet, Woburn. Many food establishments on Route 28, Exits 38A and B off Route I-95/State 128.
