High Power Match Rifle and Service Rifle Tournament

DATE: Sunday, May 6th, 2012

TIME: First shot: 9:00 am

OPEN TO: Everyone.

PLACE: Reading R & R Club Range. Reading, MA. One mile north from Exit 40 off I95/Route 128 onto Haverhill Street. Right turn at traffic light. Bear right onto Range Road.

ENTRIES:

Advance. Limited to 60 competitors. Post Entries only to fill out any pre-squadded relay vacancies.

FEES: Total Fee \$20.00 Make check s payable to Reading R & R Match Account.

PIT SERVICE: Not Provided. Competitors will pull targets or may bring a puller. Competitors may hire any available pullers. Competitors with physical problems pulling targets may request a puller with their advance entry- No Guarantees.

RIFLE / AMMO: Match Rifle, Service Rifle M1, M14 or M16 may be used. Competitor must provide own safe ammunition. No 55 or 62 grain .223 ammo may be fired at 600 yards.

TARGET / RULES: SR at 200, SR-3 at 300, MR-1 at 600. Current NRA High Power Rules.

OPEN BOLT INDICATOR: Will be required to be used.

MATCH: National Match Course with sighters.

First Stage: Slow fire, 200 yards, SR target, 2 ss, 10 shots standing (total 12 minutes)

Second Stage: Rapid Fire sitting , 200 yards, 2 ss, 10 shots for record.

Third Stage: Rapid Fire prone, 300 yards, 2 ss, 10 shots for record.

Fourth Stage: Slow Fire prone, 600 yards, 2 ss, 20 shots prone (total 22 minutes).

CLASSIFICATION: Shooters who do not hold a High Power Classification card or Temporary Score Book will use an assigned classification or fire in the Master Class. Five or more unclassified shooters at the discretion of the Match Director may constitute a separate class. "As Issued M-1" class accepted per NRA rules.

There will be separate categories for Match and Service Rifle. If less than five competitors in the combined High Masters class, they will fire for the open award only.

AWARDS: There will be no cash awards.

There will be one Match Winner in each category and one award for each five shooters in each class/category. Classes/categories with less than 5 competitors will be combined with the next category and/or class until five or more are reached. Competitors are limited to one award. Highest scoring Club member in each Category will be named the Club National Match Course Match Rifle Champion and Club National Match Course Service Rifle Champion and receive a keeper trophy.

SQUADDING: All relays will be squadded. Squadding that is not picked up by 8:45 am will be passed to the waiting list. Please arrive by 8:30 am.

SCORING: Each relay will score for one other relay.

ACCOMMODATIONS: Clubhouse available for overnight use on Friday and Saturday. Non-club members must make advance arrangements to ensure club gate access. Bring your own bedding. Self-contained camping vehicles may stay overnight on club grounds. Indoor facilities. Many motels in the area. Check Yellow Pages for Ramada Inn, Days Inn and Howard Johnson, Lord Wakefield, Wakefield; Colonial Hilton, Wakefield; Woburn Inn, Woburn, Woburn. Many fast food establishments on Route 28 (Exits 38A and B off Route I95/State 128) in Reading and Stoneham.
